PARENT CODE OF CONDUCT

The Maui United Soccer Club has adopted a Zero Tolerance Policy towards verbal, physical, and sexual abuse, harassment, or threatening behavior by anyone involved in the club. All participants (including, but not limited to, parents, players, coaches, and volunteers) who are abusive (as determined by the club) toward any person (including, but not limited to, opposing teams, parents, coaches, referees, players, and spectators) will be subject to disciplinary action.

In addition, players, parents and coaches of MUSC can expect and hold me accountable for the following:

- I will not coach, criticize or instruct my child during a game. Coaching is the responsibility of the coaching staff.
- I will not address any player other than my own child to criticize or evaluate their play; and any such comments to my child will be done away from the field in a private setting.
- I will not address another parent, on my team or another team, in a negative manner regarding their child.
- I will ask my child to treat other players, coaches, fans, and officials, with respect regardless of race, gender, or ability.
- I will assist the coaching and management staff of the team, and the club in general, in creating an environment conducive to the development of the players, our team and the club.
- I will encourage my child to address any questions or concerns directly with his/her coach.
- I will wait 48 hours after a game or incident to discuss any concerns related to the game or incident with my child's coach, using the coach's preferred method of contact. I will address the coach in a courteous and respectful manner.
- I am responsible for getting my child to practice on time, in the proper training attire and helping him/her meet all the requirements of the team. When situations dictate that we cannot meet a team obligation, I will make every effort to contact the coach and/or team manager in a timely manner, prior to the missed obligation.
- The game is not about me but rather my child's soccer development and learning how to deal with winning and losing in a team environment. I will portray this attitude.
